Les paradoxes du *Messie*.

Après une interprétation magistrale du très théâtral *Saül* (*Gramophone Editor's Choice*, *Choc du Monde de la Musique*, etc.), René Jacobs se tourne vers *Le Messie*, dans sa version avec deux altos de 1750. Haendel apporta de multiples remaniements à la distribution en fonction des solistes qu'il avait à disposition en dirigeant annuellement l'ouvrage à Londres... Mais cette reconnaissance intervint bien après la création triomphale de Dublin, le 13 avril 1742 : car pour ce qui est du public londonien, *Messiah* avait dû affronter une cabale d'autant plus injustifiée que ce *Messie* s'abstenait de toute théâtralisation autour du personnage et de la Passion du Christ : l'anti-*Saül* en quelque sorte. On connaît la suite de l'histoire !
